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







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




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SMS and SMT Multiple Participation

Are you planning to take part in Erasmus+ mobility again?






Satisfaction of participants not planning to take part again (SMS and SMT)


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Aspired Level of Degree (SMS)



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
SMS Aspired Level of Degree and Multiple Participation ISCED-6 Bacherlor

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
SMS Aspired Level of Degree and Multiple Participation ISCED-7 Master











Number of Students by Host Countries



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

Type of Stay Abroad by Gender




Participants' Highest Level of Education

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


Country of First Employment by Type of Stay

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
First Employment / Gross Monthly Income



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Country of Current Employment by Type of Stay





Current Employment / Gross Monthly Income



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
